## PRONUNCIATION OF JAPANESE WORDS

The pronunciation of Japanese transcription is very simple. There are no silent letters. Each vowel should be sounded separately.

The consonants should be pronounced as in English, with “g” always hard, as in “get.”

In the English transliteration of words, the vowels should be pronounced as such:

a	e	i	o	u
<i>ah</i>	<i>eh</i>	<i>ee</i>	<i>oh</i>	<i>oo</i>



# PRONUNCIATION OF CHINESE WORDS

Hanyu Pinyin (The universal modern standard)

## Consonants (Pinyin):

c = ts (as in "hats")

q = ch (as in "cheat") Qing dynasty = Ch'ing dynasty

r = something between American r and French j) jui scepter

x = sh (as in "sheet")

z = ds (as in "fads")

zh = j (as in "Joe"; not like French j!)

## Consonants (Wade Giles)

k = g (s in great) kuan-yin = guan-yin

b = p (as in pie) bi disc = bi (bee) disc

t = d Taoism = Daoism

t' = t (as in tong)

Ts = z (as in zen)
