To help provide the best possible tour experience, I need to confirm some information before your tour:

- Will you be staying for self-guided tours? Are multiple groups at different tour times coming on one bus?
- If you don't have a lunch space reserved on your confirmation, we unfortunately are unable to accommodate last-minute requests due to limited availability.

When coming to the museum,

1. Have children wear name tags with large legible first names so we can best engage them.
2. Divide students into groups (maximum of 15 students per group) before arriving at the museum, with at least one adult chaperone assigned to each group. Encourage chaperones to help with group organization.
3. If weather permits, please leave the coats on the bus.
4. Arrive at the Third Avenue entrance, and have students wait on the bus while one contact from the school checks in with the school tour coordinator inside the Third Avenue doors. (Note for homeschool groups: communicate that parents separately arriving with students should check in with the school tour coordinator in the Third Avenue entrance.)
5. Refer to the Mia Tour Guidelines, included in your tour confirmation, and let me know of any questions you have regarding the additional guidelines. 6. While we do our best to plan tour routes to avoid any sensitive material for young children, we can not guarantee a route completely free of artworks containing nudity. Before your visit, we encourage teachers and/or chaperones to explain why students may encounter artwork with nudity on the tour of an encyclopedic art museum.
