Tour Title: You Be the Curator

Theme: Mia has lots of artwork by people indigenous to North America. This artwork spans hundreds of years. A recent discussion at Mia asked the question - where does a curator place art produced today by Native American artists? In the Americas gallery or in the contemporary galleries?

(Display the museum map with the different curatorial department labels and explain it.)

Today we are going to look at several pieces of artwork. At the end of the tour, I am going to give each of you some images of art by native people and ask you to place the images in the section of this new museum that you think it should go in.
