


Options for a new below grade car park

- 4. Northwest site (198 stalls)


















2. Make the museum more open and inviting by adding more opportunities for natural light and engagement with the outdoors






Create dramatic and inspirational spaces to enhance the visitor experience

7. Create additional art storage space on 1st floor




8. Build a new office building to increase on-site art storage and improve staff conditions
