Substitutes


Choosing substitutes is an opportunity to widen the students' knowledge of the theme and the artwork on display at Mia.

All the sets require you to select one or two substitutes for your tour.



The importance of routes!

Be prepared to find a substitute that fits best within your assigned route.




The importance of routes!

Example:

For American
Stories, the two
substitutes you
need are both at
the start or the
end of the routes.

For Cultural
Reflections in Art,
the single
substitute falls in
the middle of the
route.

 The substitute has to fit in the same slot of the route as the original object. Some routes allow you considerable freedom to choose subs; others do not.

Let the theme guide you in choosing an object. Remember the themes are broad and objects could be interpreted in different ways!



Consider possible connections to object off view.



If possible, choose an object that connects in some way (medium, material, artist) to the object off view. Consider if the substitute has good visibility and is appropriate for kids.



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Remember the period rooms!

What themes might work with the Wu Family Reception Hall? The Japanese Tea House?

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Remember the power of VTS!

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If you choose a narrative work, remember your VTS: What's going on in this picture? What do you see that makes you say that? What more can we find?


