Touch Tours at the Minneapolis Institute of Art - Approved June 2018

Tours for visitors who are blind or have low vision are conducted on an individual basis. Tours that include visitors both with and without vision are kept to a maximum of four people. The tours include objects that can be touched, as well as objects explored with the use of verbal description and tactile diagrams. Docents receive specific training in order to conduct these tours. The docent and visitor wear Nitrile or cotton gloves to examine select works of art together through touch. For objects explored using tactile diagrams, the visitor touches a raised, physical diagram of the work while the docent provides guidance through detailed visual description.

Sculpture and other three-dimensional objects (such as decorative arts) generally provide the best choices for touch tours. A list of objects approved by the curators follows this discussion. Only objects on the approved list may be used. Many works of art are too fragile to be touched. Select objects from the list that interest your visitor as you would on any tour. Consider the size, placement, and location of an object in regard to the visitor. For small children choose objects they can easily reach. The objects used for touch tours are determined on a case by case basis, according to the visitor's needs/abilities.

Full instructions for touch tours are given in the *Docent Program Handbook* located on the IPE volunteers website. Here are guidelines for your review:

- Communicate with the visitor or contact person before the tour to find out as much as you can about interests and expectations. Explain that any information the contact can give you about participants' vision loss and other disabilities will help in selecting appropriate objects.
- Meet the visitor at the Link entrance to the museum. As you approach a blind visitor, tell him or her who you
 are. If the visitor has never been to the museum before, he or she may appreciate some guidance from Third
 Avenue into the lobby. If the visitor has a guide dog, it is unlikely that he or she will need your help. Do not
 interfere with a visitor's normal procedures, whether using a cane or a guide dog.
- Ask visitors for their preference in being guided through the museum. Some will prefer to hold your arm or touch your back. Others will depend on a guide dog. Do not touch the person's cane or guide dog. As you approach stairs or any other obstacle, give a verbal warning. Give specific verbal directions such as: "we are approaching six steps going up," "there's a display case to your right," or "there's a post directly in front of you." Remember that pointing and gesturing are not effective.
- Give the object a brief visual exam before touching it, looking for any insecurities or damage. Lifting paint, varnish or gilding, loose parts, or splinters are examples. If discovered, report them to a guard or the curator of the department so they can take the appropriate action. Do not touch objects with insecure features.
- Remove rings, other jewelry, watches, and badges that might scratch the art and put on gloves (both docent and visitor). The gloves are available in the Tour Office; make sure they are the appropriate size for each visitor. Bring extra pairs of gloves in case they get dirty midway through the tour to avoid transferring dirt from one object to another. Touch with gentle pressure, never grabbing or grasping an object. Return cotton gloves to the Tour Office to be washed and used again. Nitrile gloves can be thrown away at the end of the tour.
- Combine touching and verbal description during the tour. Use highly descriptive language to illustrate and enliven your commentary. It's alright to say "see" or "look." Don't talk throughout the tour; allow visitors time to quietly explore the works of art after you have guided them. Take their directions on how you can help. Make sure that only one visitor at a time touches the art, with or without your assistance.
- Guide visitors back to the museum entrance at the end of the tour, if desired.
