





Best practices for Art Carts





- **Be prepared** to discuss all objects on the Art Cart. Stress the fragility and authenticity of objects, where appropriate.
- Arrive on time (20 minutes before the shift begins) to ensure the cart is ready for visitors.
- Be outgoing, friendly and welcoming. If able to do so, stand up when interacting with visitors.
- **Be proactive and invite visitors** to explore the Art Cart. Tell visitors "Do touch!" is the rule.
- Engage visitors in open-ended discussions about Art Cart objects. Stimulate as many of the five senses as possible/practical.
- **Establish connections** between the objects on the Art Cart and the permanent collection.
- Allow visitors to voice their choice and direct the discussion/discovery at the Cart.
