ReVisión: Art in the Americas

Featuring nearly 130 objects from the Denver Art Museum's Ancient and Latin American collections, this exhibition tells a visually compelling narrative about the formation of the Americas from 100 BCE to today. The thematic presentation explores land, people, and place by linking ancient and contemporary artworks that address political and social issues at the heart of the region's cultural heritage.

"ReVisión: Art in the Americas" features interpretation in both English and Spanish, including panel and label copy.

- 1. To raise awareness for the exhibition

Key Messages

- 1. Journey across the vast geographic region of central, south and island nations of Latin America in *ReVisión: Art in the Americas*, on view at Mia July 1st September 27th, 2023.
- 2. Explore nearly 130 artworks that together express aspects of the experience of being Latin American, and reflect how the past continues to shape our lives today through examples of resilience, resistance, and resourcefulness.
- 3. The exhibition shows 2,500 years of artistic production by artists indigenous to the Americas and those descended from and/or influenced by European colonizers.

<u>Audiences</u>

- 1. The local Latin American community, because the exhibition is a recognition of their history, traditions, and cultural legacy.
- 2. Art lovers or culturally curious Mia visitors, because they will discover new artists and new subjects through links between the past and the present.
- 3. Family / intergenerational groups, because the artwork spans history and encourages contemplation about identity and culture.

Attendance goal: 25,000

Opportunities:

- 1. This is Mia's first special exhibition centered on pan-Latin American art, an opportunity to connect with local Hispanic audiences in a deeper way.
- 2. Also, many elements of the exhibition will be bilingual, making this a more accessible experience for Spanish speakers.
- 3. This exhibition features nearly 130 objects from the Denver Art Museum's Ancient and Latin American collections, an opportunity to showcase new-to-Minnesota artworks and leverage existing media and buzz for the exhibition.
- 4. This is Valeria Piccoli's first exhibition at Mia as the institution's first-ever curator of Latin American art.

Challenges:

- 1. Making the exhibition feel unique to Mia since it is traveling from DAM.
- 2. Welcoming a new audience that may not already be familiar with Mia.
- 3. Encouraging existing audiences to be culturally curious.

Denver Art Museum curators Victoria Lyall and Jorge Rivas join Valéria Piccoli, Ken and Linda Cutler Chair of the Arts of the Americas and Curator of Latin American Art at Mia, for a conversation around the exhibition. Considering 2,500 years of artistic production, the narrative of the exhibition brings together historical objects and contemporary art to form a single interwoven story, devoid of chronology. The thematic presentation addresses issues that are at the core of the region's cultural legacy and will be at the center of this conversation.

ReVision: A New Look at Art in the Americas considers what makes the Americas the Americas. The Spanish Conquest of the Aztec Empire was a key factor in the Spanish colonization of the Americas. After the conquest, there was a struggle to preserve the region's culture, heritage, and history as its people strived to rebuild upon what was left. At the same time, a new geographic and cultural identity was being forged that brought together aspects of Spanish culture along with the practices and traditions of the Africans and Native Americans who lived in the region.



ReVisión collects essays from scholars of Latin American art history to help others understand the region's nuanced history of creation, destruction, and renewal. In addition to essays, ReVisión showcases work from artists such as Alexander Apóstol, Juan Enrique Bedoya, Johanna Calle, and Ronny Quevedo in order to help visualize the questions of identity, exploitation of natural resources, and displacement from both before and after the conquest.
