Introduction to Mia

Arts of Africa

Discover highlights of art from the diverse continent of Africa, looking at objects of daily use to regalia for royalty. Learn about masquerade, preparing for the afterlife, and the importance of community and spiritual beliefs.

Arts of Asia

Journey through China, Japan, India, and Southeast Asia, experiencing storied highlights that range from jade sculptures and Buddhist shrines, to monumental landscapes and delicate decorative arts.

Arts of the Americas

Observe how artists tap into their unique heritages to illustrate life and culture in the Americas through time. Through these diverse perspectives, explore engaging stories shown in a range of media and materials.

Arts of Europe



- Materials to borrow stored in School Services




Streamlining communications on multi-visit school tours

- If not, you will contact the school.


Multi-visit Lead Guide


October In-gallery conversation: Telling Stories Gather around works of art to look, listen, and tell your own stories.

December Guided tour: Celebrating the Season Learn how cultures around the world celebrate the season of rebirth and renewal.






